SJR 40 - Supporting Constitutional Sheriffs

What is SJR 40?

Senate Joint Resolution No. 40 (SJR 40) is a proposed amendment to Article VII of the Missouri Constitution. This amendment seeks to strengthen the role of sheriffs by ensuring that each county (with certain exceptions) elects a sheriff to serve as the chief law enforcement officer. The resolution outlines the sheriff's duties, election process, and protections against removal, emphasizing local accountability and authority.

Key Provisions

• Election of Sheriffs: Requires that sheriffs be elected by a majority vote in each county (except as noted) for a four-year term, reinforcing democratic control at the local level.

- Sheriff's Duties: Establishes specific responsibilities, including:
 - Maintaining peace and quelling riots.
 - Apprehending felons and other lawbreakers.
 - Executing court processes and managing deputies.

• **Protection from Removal:** Limits the removal of sheriffs to a writ of quo warranto initiated by the Missouri Attorney General, ensuring stability and due process.

• Exceptions: Excludes cities not within counties (e.g., St. Louis City) and certain charter counties with existing governance structures.
